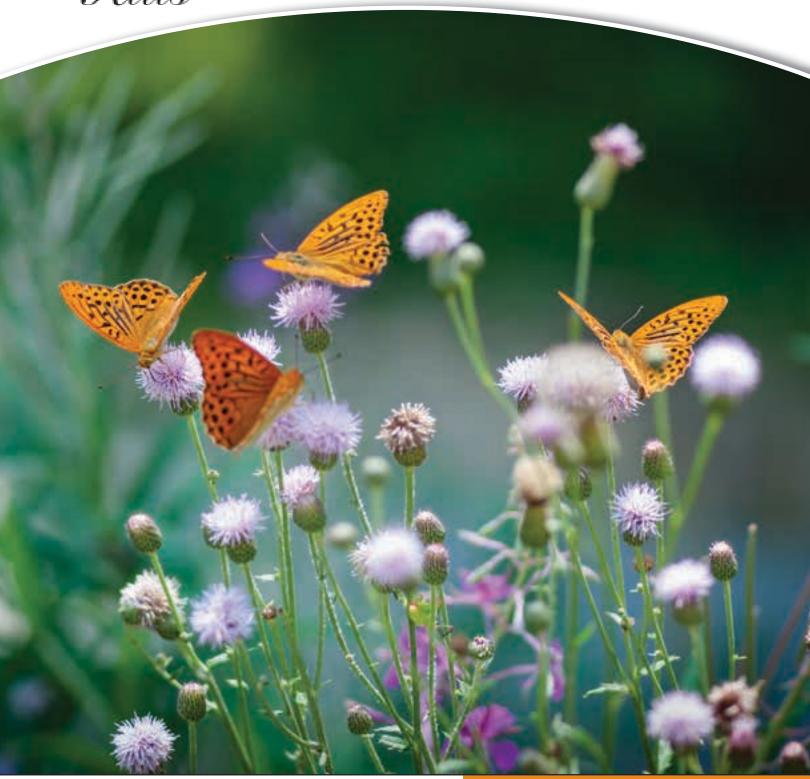

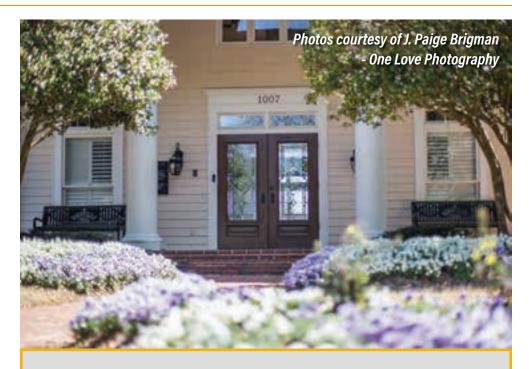

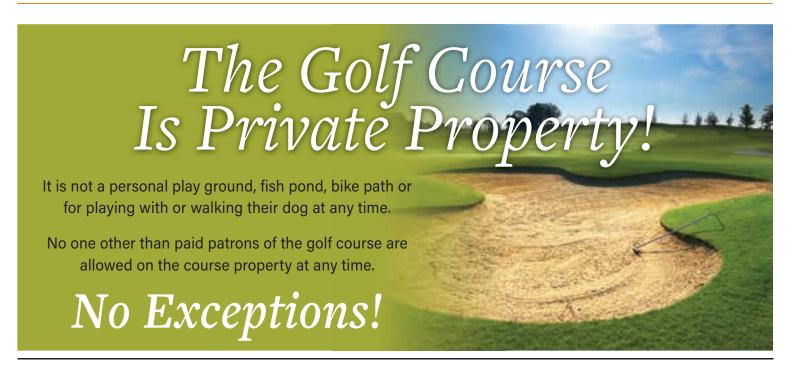

Hiring The Right Guy For Your Job Will Save You Money And Time By Doug Patten

make you aware of a few things while deciding on the right contractor.

If you have a landscaping job, hire a landscaper. The guy who cuts the grass MAY be able to do the job but verify before you write a check. If your landscaper can do the job have him show you examples, not just one but several. What is his guarantee? Where will he be in a year? How long has he been doing this line of work? It may be a good idea to buy the plants from a supplier that has their own guarantee, just in case something doesn't make it, or he is no place to be found. A lot of money can be wasted on grass, trees

and bushes if they are not done correctly.

If you're going install a pool, don't hire a landscaper, hire an established pool company. There are plenty of companies that do quality work. If your yard needs some grading or walls to make the pool site work in your yard, find out first! This may be sub-contracted out to some guy the pool company "always uses". You don't know him, he has made no promises to you and he is on your property moving dirt that has a significant impact to the water runoff and possible erosion to your neighbor's yard. The county and state take this very seriously. If you have to move dirt or grade, you need to see a plan that shows what precautions and steps are being taken to meet county ordinances and protect your liability. If it rains while the dirt is being moved, the contractor can't work. The raw dirt gets soaked and muddy silt runs downhill to ruin whatever is in its way. BMP's are called BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES. They are required ANYTIME you grade or dig with a piece of equipment. Don't let your pool company tell you otherwise. If they cut corners it can be a HUGE mistake and can cost you dearly.

If you are going add an addition to your house, like a deck, sun room, pergola, DON'T hire the pool guy. Hire a qualified contractor. Look for a company with a license, bonding, and a good history. Too many times we hear the story, about the guy who got his deposit and didn't finish the work. It's in the news all the time; the old lady was taken by the smooth talking salesman. Be careful!

If you're having your roof replaced, again don't hire the wrong guy! I am repeating this statement because it's VERY important. Hire a qualified roofing company. There are plenty around that do quality work. Look for a company with a license, bonding, and a good history.

Depending on your project, check and make sure it doesn't need to be permitted by the county. A lot of good contractors may think they can just get in and out without taking the proper steps to permit. It's done all the time. Don't risk being the one who gets caught. Have the contractor include it into your cost estimate and make sure he supplies you with a copy of the permit, a copy of his insurance and his license. DON'T take his word for it. Don't be the

easy going client, be the smart client. Ask! A good contractor has no problem supplying this info. If he is hesitant, then maybe you should be hesitant in him to doing the job.

Hiring the right contractor can make or break your bank. It can make or break your project. It can make or break your spirit. Not to mention the tension it will cause within the household trying to get through the nightmare of a nice guy but a bad contractor. Don't be a know it all and don't become a victim. Ask for help. Ask for references and follow up on them. Go by their example projects and ask the home owner about the contractor. You may be surprised about the answers you will get. People love to sing the praises of a good contractor and they are very quick to identify the bad ones. You will be glad you asked.

Good Luck with your projects and don't forget to fill out your ACC modification form for all projects before you start. Front or Back. Top or Bottom. Let us help. The ACC volunteers are not here to police this neighborhood, however sometimes it may seem like we do. We are here to help protect everyone's home investment; everybody has an opinion and believes their idea is the best. We volunteer to help ensure everyone works within the same guidelines to have unity in our neighborhood.

Sink Holes - To Fill Or Not To Fill Don't Let It Become A Money Pit

inkholes, or sinking areas, are a reoccurring problem many of our homeowners are seeing in their yards. Sinking areas may be a result of poorly compacted yards, slopes, or backfill over buried storm pipes. Some types of sinking areas are easier to fix than others. Identifying the cause of the sinking area is critical in determining the resolution. Often homeowners attempt to fill these holes with fill dirt, only to see the issue reappear after a period of time. Sink holes can be result from several things, however most sink holes are the result of construction debris buried by contractors during the building of your home. Don't blame your builder, Towne Lake was developed during the 90's and, and the practice of burying construction materials was accepted within the county until the late 90's. Building Inspectors and County officials learned over time that this practice led to sink holes. They have since changed the law and stepped up prevention in newer construction.

Buried debris will decay based on the material makeup and the weight of the dirt on top. As you try and fix the sinkhole by adding dirt, the additional weight causes further break-up and decay of the buried materials. This turns into an endless cycle until all the materials fully decay. The process never ends. The best solution is to identify the true cause of the sinking area and to seek a professional opinion on the best resolution. Take care to avoid non-reputable contractors who may attempt to take advantage of a helpless homeowner. A trusted contractor, that is skilled in this type repair and licensed by the state, is very important. A sink hole can be a money pit. What you see on the surface may only be part of the issue. The entire hole must be dug out and all materials removed,

then refilled properly with good fill dirt. A quality contractor should know how to accurately identify the problem and the correct process to fix.

This article is being written to help you understand sinkholes. You may have been a victim of an out dated practice by your home contractor, but don't be a victim twice trying to repair it. This type of repair must be permitted by the ACC Committee. I am the current ACC Chairman, as well as a State Licensed Design Professional. My contact information is available through the management office. There are other neighbors in this neighborhood that are qualified to help you as well. It is my goal as ACC Chairman and a fellow TLH homeowner to help my neighbors in Towne lake work through issues just like this.

- Request that the shipper <u>hold your package</u> at Its pick-up facility so you can pick it up in person at your convenience
- Provide <u>delivery instructions</u> to the shipper so that packages can be left at a safe location at your home that is <u>out of sight from the street</u>
- If your employer will allow it, <u>have packages delivered to your place of</u> work
- Consider a <u>visible surveillance camera</u> and a security company sign near the front door

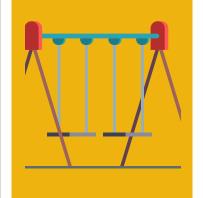

Winter Lawn Tips

Warm Season Grasses

(Bermuda, Centipede, Zoysia, St. Augustine)

For Established Lawns

ontinue using a pre-emergent through April. For persistent weeds, begin using post-emergent sprays after mowing at least twice, usually in May.

Aerate in late April or May to reduce the introduction of weed seeds.

Remember to adjust irrigation if April brings lots of showers. Too much water may allow fungal pathogens to thrive. Healthy turf needs about 1 inch of water per week. Morning irrigation is best.

Apply a fertilizer approved for your type of turf after the last frost and once the lawn is 50% green (usually April). Follow the manufacturer's directions as well as the recommendations provided in the Soil Test results. Take special care not to over-fertilize Centipedegrass. Review specific requirements for your turf at www.caes2.caes.uga.uga.

For Newly Installed Lawns

The best time to install warm-season turf is late spring or early summer.

Shade-tolerant options for warm-season turfs include Zoysiagrasses (Leisure Time, Geo, JaMur, Zeon, and Zorro) or St. Augustine grasses (Palmetto, Mercedes, and Raleigh).

Mow newly installed lawns at least twice before application of a pre-emergent.

Cool Season Grasses

(Tall Fescue or Bluegrass)

For Established Lawns

Continue proper mowing height (about 2.5 inches). Raise another 0.5 inch in dry conditions.

Consider the amount of rainfall when setting irrigation. Irrigate 0.5 to 1 inch of water per week.

Although possible to complete in March, April is one of the best times to aerate and fertilize. However, be sure to aerate prior to applying fertilizers or herbicides. Complete these activities by the end of April.

If you did not treat with a spring pre-emergent herbicide to prevent crabgrass and other spring weeds in February, you may still do so in March. However, avoid using pre-emergents in April and May. It is appropriate to apply a post-emergent herbicide spray to target broadleaf weeds, such as dandelion and chickweed at any time. A post-emergent for grassy weeds, such as dallisgrass, may be applied in early May.

Select a fertilizer approved for your cool-season turf. Follow the manufacturer's directions as well as recommendations provided in the Soil Test results.

If needed, set your irrigation for 1 inch per week. Less frequent and deep watering encourages growth of a strong root system. Morning irrigation is optimal. Do not over water, as April rains may contribute to turf needs. Consider using a rain gauge.

Apply equal amounts of a fertilizer approved for cool-season grasses during February and April.

For Newly Installed Lawns

The best time to install a cool-season turf is in the fall before the first frost. It may also be planted in the spring through the end of April.

Shade-tolerant options for cool-season turfs include Fine Fescue grasses, Ryegrass and Kentucky Bluegrass in partial shade.

Mow newly installed lawns at least twice before applying a pre-emergent herbicide.

Disease & Insect Control for All Lawns

This has been an extremely wet season, so check for fungal disease. As your lawn comes out of dormancy, check for dead or dark patches with clearly defined edges. Apply an approved fungicide as needed.

Check for webworm, armyworm, and/or cutworm infestations. Webworms leave a veil-like webbing on the turf surface, which is easily seen in the morning before the dew burns off. Circular, sunken patches of cut leaf blades might indicate the presence of cutworms. Armyworms leave significant damage by chewing patches of blades to the ground. White grubs feed on grass roots. Control them with an approved insecticide before they move deeper in the soil. Patches of wilted, yellow grass might indicate the presence of chinch bugs. St. Augustine and Centipede are especially susceptible, but other grasses are also at risk. If needed, treat the soil with an approved product for the specific type of infestation. Control strategies differ so be sure to follow instructions on the product label.

- Prune back overgrown shrubs, trees and ornamental grasses; except for those which bloom in early spring such as Azaleas & Camellias as you will cut off all the flower buds
- □ Lawns Weeds: Pull/Treat weeds

- Lawn Fertilization / Pre-emergent: Fertilize Fescue lawns now, Bermuda/Zoysia yards once they turn 50% green. Apply Pre-emergent to all lawns to prevent crabgrass & annual weeds
- Plant cool season vegetables such as lettuce, broccoli, spinach & cauliflower as well as berry bushes and fruit trees. Start seeds of warm season vegetables and flowers indoors.
- □ Inspect the sprinkler system
- Clean out gutters

- Paint /repair your mailbox if needed
- Power wash mildew / dirt from your home, driveway and sidewalks
- Prepare planters
- □ Remember the Birds
- Clean out bird houses and bird baths so they are ready to welcome new residents.
- Keep Feeding. Be sure to keep feeders full to attract and keep birds in your yard.
