



Unfortunately, there have been many recent instances of unapproved tree removal within our community. While the Association makes every effort to accommodate homeowner requests, there are instances in which it is not appropriate to approve the removal of trees. Trees provide aesthetic appeal to our community, provide necessary buffers between properties in many instances, play an important visual role in streetscapes, and oftentimes play an integral role in the overall landscaping of a Lot. As a reminder, the Towne Lake Hills Community Association fine policy for unapproved tree removal is as follows:

Any homeowner who removes, or allows to be removed, trees without obtaining pre-approval by from the Towne Lake Hills Architectural Control Committee per Article VII Section 13 of the Declaration of Protective Covenants, will be subject to an immediate \$250.00 fine. Further, the Association, in certain instances, may assess additional fines in excess of the \$250.00 initial fine based on the nature of the violation, in addition to possible remediation (installation of new trees) and all other enforcement remedies afforded the Association by Article XV of the Protective Covenants.

- Make sure the post is securely in the ground, not wobbly and is standing up straight.
- Check to insure that the numbers are securely on the mailbox.
- Both door and flag must be present, in good condition.
- Mailbox needs to be clean and free from debris left by perching birds, mildew and faded paint.

SUMMER VACATION SAFETY ALERT

See Something - Say Something



Attention Neighbors,

Summer is just around the corner and is a time when many residents go away for vacation. There are some specific steps that you can take to help avoid becoming a victim of crime this summer.

How Can You Your Summer Safer?

Tips to avoid becoming a victim while away on vacation:

- 1. Have a friend pick up your mail and newspapers. You can also have the post office stop your mail while away on vacation.
- 2. Have a neighbor take in your trashcans if left out.
- 3. Have someone keep an eye on your house.
- 4. You can call the Cherokee County Sheriff's Office nonemergency number 678-493-4080 and tell them you will be away and to have an officer check your house. As a community service, they will have an officer check up on your house to check your doors and the security of your home while you are away.
- 5. Have timers set up on lights and TV.
- 6. Stop all deliveries.
- 7. Place valuables in a safe deposit box.
- 8. Park unattended cars in the garage.
- 9. Remove valuables from cars and lock the doors.
- 10. Insure that your doors are locked.

Safety Tips and Suggestions:

- Always be aware of your surroundings.
- Always make sure all doors and windows are locked in your house and car
- When out shopping, try to park in well-lighted areas with good visibility close to walkways, stores and people.
- Consider an alarm system for your home if you do not have one.
- We have had a great suggestion passed on from one of our residents; if you do not have an alarm system, place your car remote next to your bed at night and you can use the panic button to set off your car alarm if needed. This can also be used if you have a medical emergency and can't get to a phone or anytime walking to or from your car.
- Never give out your personal information.
- Do not open your door for someone you do not know or are not expecting. We occasionally have people going door to door to try and sell products or services. Keep in mind that you do not even need to answer your door or communicate with them in any way. If they persist call 911.
- Trust your instincts. If you feel uncomfortable in a place or situation, leave quickly.
- Call 911 if you notice suspicious activity or people and report it immediately.





- Mowing needs to be done regularly to keep grass at its needed height. Never mow more than one-third of the length of the grass blade.
- -If you use post-emergent, put it only on the spots where you see the weeds.

Cool Season Grasses (Fescue, Kentucky Bluegrass)

- The most important thing you can do for cool-season grasses during the summer is to not fertilize them or overwater them.
- Mowing height should be between two and three inches.

Warm Season Grasses (Bermuda grass, Centipede, St. Augustine):

• Mowing height should be between one and two inches.

- Feed your lawn with a high nitrogen content fertilizer. Only do it every other month during the growing season or it will promote disease.
- If you have thin patches in your lawn or are seeding a new lawn, it is a good time to plant your seed. Mulch lightly after seeding and keep seeds moist for two weeks after they sprout.
- For faster results in establishing a lawn, sod may be used. Also water lightly every other day for the first two weeks after putting down and make sure it does not go more than a week without water during the summer.

Spring Yard Clean-up List

Spring is almost here, we all want to be outside enjoying the great weather and not taking care of the yard. All yards will need some TLC after the winter season. If you take time now, you can prevent problems in the future. Make a checklist of what needs to be done, take a weekend and get ready to enjoy your yard.

- Prune back overgrown shrubs, trees and ornamental grasses; except for those which bloom in early spring such as Azaleas & Camellias as you will cut off all the flower buds
- Lawns Weeds: Pull/Treat weeds
- Lawn Fertilization / Pre-emergent: Fertilize Fescue lawns now, Bermuda/Zoysia yards once they turn 50% green. Apply Pre-emergent to all lawns to prevent crabgrass & annual weeds
- Plant cool season vegetables such as lettuce, broccoli, spinach & cauliflower as well as berry bushes and fruit trees. Start seeds of warm season vegetables and flowers indoors.
- Inspect the sprinkler system
- Clean out gutters
- Clean up debris/leaves
- Mulch/Pine Straw
- Paint /repair your mailbox if needed

- Power wash mildew / dirt from your home, driveway and sidewalks
- Prepare planters
- Sit Back and Enjoy!

Remember the Birds

- Clean out bird houses and bird baths so they are ready to welcome new residents.
- Keep Feeding. Be sure to keep feeders full to attract and keep birds in your yard.





Towne Lake Hills HOA Policy for Fecal or Vomit Contamination in the Pools

Each time a fecal or vomit incident occurs, the Towne Lake Hills Homeowners Association is required to close the pool for an emergency chemical service to re-sanitize the water. Pool closure for such accidents can be as long as 24-hours, causing inconvenience and increased costs to the many homeowners, families, and guests using the pool. While vomit accidents may be unforeseeable and unavoidable, fecal accidents can and should be prevented. To ensure fecal accidents are kept to a minimum, members are required to ensure their own children and children of their guests are wearing the appropriate approved swim diaper and plastic pants. All children not fully toilet trained must wear an approved diaper and plastic pant before entering any TLHHOA pool. If any child accompanying a homeowner has a fecal accident in the pool, and was not wearing the required diapers and plastic pants, the member will be charged a \$100.00 fine, plus any potential additional fees to sanitize the pool. Pool privileges will be suspended until the fine has been paid in full. Please note that repeated offenses may result in further and escalating actions to be determined by the TLHHOA Board of Directors.



Swimming or sunbathing is permitted only during operating hours.

Attire

Homeowners and guests should dress in attire befitting the family nature of our Community. Extremely revealing attire, such as a thong bathing suit, is not suitable for the family atmosphere of the pool.

Authority

These rules and regulations are designed to ensure the enjoyment and safety of swimmers. Parents are ultimately responsible for their child's safety. The HOA and its designated representatives shall have the authority to remove anyone from the pool area that is not abiding by the rules.

Balls and Other Recreational Objects

- Balls: The throwing of tennis or other "hard" balls and Frisbees is prohibited. Squishy balls designed for pool usage are allowed.
- Rafts and flotation devised are prohibited. Noodles and flotation devices designed for young children unable to swim are permitted.

Bather Load

East Pool: Maximum bather load is 402 individuals.

North Pool: Maximum bather load is 200 individuals.:

Children

- Parents/Guardians must insure that infants and children using the pools do not have a diarrheal illness
- Children under 8 years of age must be accompanied at all times by an adult (21 years of age or older) or person at least 15 years of age who is authorized in writing by the parent/guardian.
- Residents 12 years of age and older may bring siblings 8 years or age and older to the pool without an adult
- Play Structure (lower East Pool)
 - Children 11 years of age and older may only use the play structure when supervising a younger child
 - Children IO years of age and younger may use the pool play structure
- Water Slide, children under the age of 6 should be accompanied or supervised by an adult when using the water slide
- Non-potty trained children must wear plastic, water-tight pants. All children must be taken to the restroom to "potty." Changing diapers in the pool area is a violation of the Health Code.
- Children are not allowed to stop the flow of water in the fountain jets with objects or any part of their bodies.

Contamination

Any Homeowner found contaminating the pool is subject to a fine and/or suspension of amenity privileges.

- Each individual should shower and rinse thoroughly before using the pools
- No Food or Drink are allowed within 5 feet of the pool
- No gum is allowed in the pool area.
- Bathers with open wounds, skin conditions or any communicable condition are not allowed
- There is to be no spitting, "spouting," or blowing of noses in the pool.

Glass and Sharp Objects

There are to be no glass containers, sharp objects, or other hazardous materials in the pool area.

Guest Policy

East Pool: Each household in good standing may bring up to four (4) accompanied guests.

North Pool: Each household in good standing may bring up to two (2) accompanied guests.

Unaccompanied guests are not permitted at either the East or North pool.

Pets and Service Animals

No pets are allowed in the recreational facilities. Service animals are allowed.

Profanity

Absolutely no profanity of any kind will be permitted.

Radios

Radio volume shall be kept at a level that does not disturb others.

Reservations

Usage of all areas of the pool are on a "first come, first served" basis.

Running and Horseplay

Running and horseplay in the pool area is prohibited.

Smoking and Tobacco

No tobacco products or smoking is permitted in the pool area. This prohibition encompasses e-cigarettes and vaping.

Swimming Lessons

All private and group swim lessons are to be given by HOA approved vendors only.

Trash

It is the homeowner's responsibility to dispose of or remove any trash from the pool area that they created.






