

t's great to feel a bit cooler temperatures lately as we head into fall. The cooler mornings let you know that the fall colors in the landscape are just around the corner. Fall is such a great time of year to be living in Cherokee county / Towne Lake. If your family hasn't been up to the park / pool / tennis area to enjoy some time outdoors this summer, make sure you do so as the cooler temps make being outdoors so much more pleasant.

A couple of projects designed to help you enjoy our neighborhood amenities have been delayed a bit due to sourcing and permitting issues, but are on still track to get done this fall. We now anticipate the playground renovations will start sometime in late October. In addition, the golf club (Tavern) will be expanding the deck and adding a roof over much of it later this fall. It will be great to sit out on the deck and watch some fall football or view the golfers come in while having a good meal and drinks.

Safety: We received feedback that many of you like to sit on the deck at the Tavern while your kids play on the playground and are concerned about safety when kids are crossing the parking lot. As a result of that feedback and the increased traffic into the Tavern, we installed speed humps between the playground and the side entrance to the Tavern. A "Slow, children at play" sign was also installed and a crosswalk will be painted as part of the playground renovation. Please be cautious and mindful of the kids in and around the park area when you drive through the parking lot.

Request for Feedback: The Association board is now in the budgeting process for 2019. As a part of that process we do a thorough review of our reserve spending, which is how we maintain / improve our facilities. Should you have any recommendations, now is the time to let your voice be

heard. If there are specific areas you feel the board should focus on, contact one of the board members and let us know.

Did You Know: The neighborhood association (Board & Committees) are run by volunteers who are your neighbors? ...with the help of Sixes property management of course. 



Unapproved Tree Removal

Unfortunately, there have been many recent instances of unapproved tree removal within our community. While the Association makes every effort accommodate homeowner requests, there are instances in which it is not appropriate to approve the removal of trees. Trees provide aesthetic appeal to our community, provide necessary buffers between properties in many instances, play an important visual role in streetscapes, and oftentimes play an integral role in the overall landscaping of a Lot. As a reminder, the Towne Lake Hills Community Association fine policy for unapproved tree removal is as follows:

Any homeowner who removes, or allows to be removed, trees without obtaining pre-approval by from the Towne

Lake Hills Architectural Control Committee per Article VII Section 13 of the Declaration of Protective Covenants, will be subject to an immediate \$250.00 fine. Further, the Association, in certain instances, may assess additional fines in excess of the \$250.00 initial fine based on the nature of the violation, in addition to possible remediation (installation of new trees) and all other enforcement remedies afforded the Association by Article XV of the

Choosing Paint Colors for your Home

ACC and HOA Board

n order to help guide the exterior paint approval process, an approved Paint Palette Book (PPB) of colors for the exterior of our homes has been created for our Towne Lake Hills (TLH) Neighborhoods. It will be accessible during normal business hours and may be viewed, copied, or photographed but

may not be removed from the office of Sixes Management Group, located upstairs in the TLH Clubhouse. Additionally, a copy of the book, with representative samples is available on our web site. However, these may be helpful but they cannot represent the exact hue or color of actual products being applied. It would be advisable to go to the Sherwin Williams store, across from the Aspen Carwash on Bells Ferry and ask for chip samples of the exact color for better viewing. These paint chips can be matched by any paint supplier you prefer to complete the approval process.

In beginning the process of paint color selection, a new sequence of approval steps will be required. The new request form should be available shortly. Utilizing the PPB will still require ACC approval. Requests for deviation from the PPB will be considered on a case by case basis and

ultimately may require full Board approval, thus potentially delaying the process.

Each submission for exterior paint approval will need to include a sample of how the selected colors will appear upon your home. This is easily accomplished by utilizing a professional tool available at www.

you to upload an exact photograph of your home and add in the proposed colors for easy viewing. A proposed colorized full page picture will be required with each application. Homeowners may certainly choose any painter or paint supplier they wish; however, the tool rendering the proposed colors, is specific to one vendor. The colors being submitted must match the actual product to be applied.

This new PPB and the color tool will help our neighbors have more direction and assistance in the planning phase and should help streamline the approval process. Thank you for your patience in this transition and the substantial effort to protect the value of our individual homes and maximize the ability for personalization.

Golf Carts in the Neighborhood

In general, the usage of golf carts on public roadways is illegal in the State of Georgia and in Cherokee County. There is ongoing discussion within our county to enable certain neighborhoods to self-determine feasibility and allow the usage of golf carts within the development boundaries

The TLH-HOA Board of Directors has reviewed this issue and has determined; safety of our residents is of primary concern and has voted to maintain the current status and prevent the use of golf carts on our neighborhood roads. The design of our streets is not consistent with neighborhoods or even incorporated areas currently

allowing golf carts (i.e. Peachtree City).
Further, the terrain and hilly nature of our street design could potentially create further traffic hazards, congestion, or additional distractions which are not in the best safety interests of the whole community.

The Board hereby endorses the present traffic code which restricts from our TLHs neighborhoods, any motorized vehicle not bearing a license plate documenting approval by the state of Georgia as roadworthy on normal public

thoroughfares and possessing the proper safety equipment required. More specifically golf carts and ATVs.

Fall Lawn Tips

Warm Season Grasses

(Bermuda, Centipede, Zoysia, St. Augustine)

For Established Lawns

- Warm season turfs may be stressed during the summer months. Mow at the proper height through the season. However, leave Bermuda and Zoysia about 3 inches before dormancy.
- Aerate Bermuda and Zoysia through September.
- Do not dethatch during dormancy.
- Apply a winter pre-emergent herbicide in early September for Bermuda, Zoysia, and Centipede. Use a post-emergent to spot spray for minor broadleaf weed control through October and a post-emergent for grassy weeds in September. September is the best time to apply a winter preemergent for St. Augustine, but it may still be applied as late as October.
- Fertilize Bermuda, Zoysia and St. Augustine grasses in early September. This is the last feeding for the season. It's too late to fertilize Centipede lawns.
- Overseed your established Bermuda lawn in September, although October is best.
- Follow "water-wise" irrigation methods to ensure a healthy lawn and promote a strong root system through September.
 Set irrigation to apply 1 inch of water per week. Consider rainfall amounts. Do not overwater.

For Newly Installed Lawns

- Though not optimal, Zoysia and Bermuda turf may be installed in September.
- Plant early enough to establish the root system before dormancy.
 Irrigate the first two to three weeks to establish turf.

Cool-Season Grasses

(Tall Fescue, Kentucky Bluegrass)

For Established Lawns

- Mow at the proper height through the growth season.
- For healthy lawns, core aerate during this period, especially if you plan to overseed. October is the best month for aeration, but September and November are possible months.
- If needed, rake and dethatch in September. Overseed thinning areas and top-dress, if necessary.
- Fertilize Fescue turf in October/ November. Apply lime as recommended by soil test.
- Apply an approved pre-emergent in early September, unless you plan to sod or reseed. You may also use a post-emergent spot spray for broadleaf weeds, such as chickweed or dandelion.
- Reduce irrigation to 1 inch every 10-14 days as the weather cools. Determine irrigation needs depending on the amount of rainfall received.

For Newly Installed Lawns

- Early October is the best time to seed or overseed fescue.
 However, turf or sprigs may be planted in late September.
- Look for the "Blue Tag" certified seed to insure that you are purchasing a high-quality product.

Disease & Insect Control for All Lawns

This has been an extremely wet season, so check for fungal disease. As nights become cooler, check for dead or dark patches with clearly defined edges. Apply an approved fungicide as needed.

Check for webworm, armyworm, and/or cutworm infestations. Webworms leave a veil-like webbing on the turf surface, which is easily seen in the morning before the dew burns off. Circular, sunken patches of cut leaf blades might indicate the presence of cutworms. Armyworms leave significant damage by chewing patches of blades to the ground. White grubs feed on grass roots. Control them during August with an approved insecticide before they move deeper in the soil. Patches of wilted, yellow grass might indicate the presence of chinch bugs. St. Augustine and Centipede are especially susceptible, but other grasses are also at risk.

If needed, treat the soil with an approved product for the specific type of infestation. Control strategies differ so be sure to follow instructions on the product label.

- Request a <u>specific delivery date and time</u> from the shipper when you know you will be home
- Have packages delivered to a place where they can be <u>received in</u> <u>person</u>, such as the home of a <u>trusted neighbor</u>, who stays home during the day
- Request that the shipper <u>hold your package</u> at Its pick-up facility so you can pick it up in person at your convenience
- Provide <u>delivery instructions</u> to the shipper so that packages can be left at a safe location at your home that is <u>out of sight from the street</u>
- If your employer will allow it, <u>have packages delivered to your place</u>
 of work
- Consider a <u>visible surveillance camera</u> and a security company sign near the front door

Attention Neighbors,

Summer is just around the corner and is a time when many residents go away for vacation. There are some specific steps that you can take to help avoid becoming a victim of crime this summer.

How Can You Your Summer Safer?

Tips to avoid becoming a victim while away on vacation:

- 1. Have a friend pick up your mail and newspapers. You can also have the post office stop your mail while away on vacation.
- 2. Have a neighbor take in your trashcans if left out.
- 3. Have someone keep an eye on your house.
- 4. You can call the Cherokee County Sheriff's Office non-emergency number 678-493-4080 and tell them you will be away and to have an officer check your house. As a community service, they will have an officer check up on your house to check your doors and the security of your home while you are away.
- 5. Have timers set up on lights and TV.
- 6. Stop all deliveries.
- 7. Place valuables in a safe deposit box.
- 8. Park unattended cars in the garage.
- 9. Remove valuables from cars and lock the doors.
- 10. Insure that your doors are locked.

Safety Tips and Suggestions:

- Always be aware of your surroundings.
- Always make sure all doors and windows are locked in your house and car.
- When out shopping, try to park in well-lighted areas with good visibility close to walkways, stores and people.
- Consider an alarm system for your home if you do not have one.
- We have had a great suggestion passed on from one of our residents; if you do not have an alarm system, place your car remote next to your bed at night and you can use the panic button to set off your car alarm if needed. This can also be used if you have a medical emergency and can't get to a phone or anytime walking to or from your car.
- Never give out your personal information.
- Do not open your door for someone you do not know or are not expecting. We occasionally have people going door to door to try and sell products or services. Keep in mind that you do not even need to answer your door or communicate with them in any way. If they persist call 911.
- Trust your instincts. If you feel uncomfortable in a place or situation, leave quickly.
- Call 911 if you notice suspicious activity or people and report it immediately.

EDITH

We would like to encourage every family to practice home escape plans and know where your meeting place will be. The acronym EDITH stands for Exit Drills in the Home. This is vital for all who live in your homes. Having two ways out of each room and knowing where you are going to meet when you get out to assure all have exited. Practice the plan with members of the family. Children as young as 3 can follow an escape plan if they have practiced it often. Teach your children not to hide when they encounter fire — not even if they have started it. Firefighters in protective gear can look frightening. Take them to a fire station to see and to meet firemen and learn



that they are friends and come to help.

Having working smoke alarms (detectors) and testing them monthly will increase your survival rate. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) states that in every 3 out of 5 fire deaths there were no smoke alarms or ones that were not working. Parents should install an alarm on each level of the home and outside bedrooms or other sleeping areas. Remember to test alarms monthly change batteries at least once a year - preferably twice, at biannual time changes.

If an infant sleeps in a separate room, place an alarm in the room. Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke

spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can get outside quickly.



GRILLING AND FIRE PITS

 When lighting your grill/ pit, be sure that there are no leaks.

- If you smell gas, turn the grill off and have the problem repaired.
- Always open the lid of the grill before lighting.
- Never leave the grill/pit unattended.
- Keep the grill/pit away from the house and deck railings.
- Maintain at least three feet of clearance for children and pets.
- Always remember to turn your grill off and the gas to it when finished.
- Always extinguish the fire pit when finished.

FALL BURNING

- When burning outdoors, please remember to obtain a burn permit through Georgia Forestry at 1-877-OK2-BURN (652-2876) or online
 - at www.gatrees.org/ onlinepermits. There are some ordinances that you need to be aware of as well.
- There is no burning allowed on Sunday's or at night.
- The fire needs to be attended to at all times.
- Piles should be kept small and only burn what is in your yard.
- No trash or building supplies are allowed to be burned.
- Woodstock proper is within the metro burning ban from May 1st through October 1st every year, which bans all outdoor burning.


