◆ACC Approval Required for Tree Removal ◆

Unfortunately, there have been many recent instances of unapproved tree removal within our community. While the Association makes every effort to accommodate homeowner requests, there are instances in which it is not appropriate to approve the removal of trees. Trees provide aesthetic appeal to our community, provide necessary buffers between properties in many instances, play an important visual role in streetscapes, and oftentimes play an integral role in the overall landscaping of a Lot. As a reminder, the Towne Lake Hills Community Association fine policy for unapproved tree removal is as follows:

Any homeowner who removes, or allows to be removed, trees without obtaining pre-approval by from the Towne Lake Hills Architectural Control Committee per Article VII Section 13 of the Declaration of Protective Covenants, will be subject to an



immediate \$250.00 fine. Further, the Association, in certain instances, may assess additional fines in excess of the \$250.00 initial fine based on the nature

of the violation, in addition to possible remediation (installation of new trees) and all other enforcement remedies afforded the Association by Article XV of the Protective Covenants.

Holiday Safety Tips

Attention Neighbors,

Winter Holidays will soon be here and is a time when many residents go away for vacation. There are some specific steps that you can take to help avoid becoming a victim of crime while away.

Tips to avoid becoming a victim while away on vacation:

- Have a friend pick up your mail and newspapers. You can also have the post office stop your mail while away on vacation.
- Have a neighbor take in your trashcans if left out.
- Have someone keep an eye on your house.
- You can call the Cherokee County Sheriff's Office nonemergency number 678-493-4080 and tell them you will be away and to have an officer check your house. As a community service, they will have an officer check up on your house to check your doors and the security of your home while you are away.
- Have timers set up on lights and TV.
- Stop all deliveries.
- Place valuables in a safe deposit box.
- Park unattended cars in the garage.
- Remove valuables from cars and lock the doors.
- Insure that your doors are locked.

TIPS FOR A SAFE AND HAPPY HOLIDAY

During the year-end holidays, people are often busy, excited, and some- times a little careless. The following are a series of holiday crime prevention tips that should be embraced this holiday season.

At Home:

- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave your house, even for a few minutes.
- Don't display holiday gifts where they can be seen from a window or doorway. Store gifts before you go away on a holiday trip.
- If you go out for the evening, turn on lights and a radio or television so the house or apartment appears to be occupied.
- Be wary of strangers soliciting for charitable donations.
 They may at- tempt to take advantage of people's generosity during the holidays. Ask for identification, how donated funds are used, if contributions are tax deductible, etc. If you aren't satisfied with the answers, don't give.
- Immediately after the holidays, mark new gifts with an identification number and record new serial numbers.
- Test your smoke detectors.

- Use only fire resistant ornaments on a holiday tree and make sure Electric lights are in good working order.
 Don't leave the lights on overnight or when you are away from home.
- If you have house guests, advise them of your security precautions and make sure they adhere to them.
- Avoid leaving boxes from purchases (especially TVs, DVD players, Computers, etc.) out on the curb for trash pickup.

Shopping:

- Shop before dark if possible. Possibly coordinate shopping trips with a friend. Never park in an unlit lot or area, no matter how convenient it is.
- Lock your packages and gifts in your vehicle's trunk. Keep your vehicle doors locked and windows closed.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Pay for purchases with a check, credit card, or debit card whenever possible.
- Be extra careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse under your arm. Keep a wallet in an inside jacket, not a back trouser pocket.
- Teach children to go to a store clerk or security guard and ask for help if you become separated. They should never go into a parking lot alone.

PACKAGE THEFT PREVENTION TIPS



- Request a <u>specific delivery date and time</u> from the shipper when you know you will be home
- Have packages delivered to a place where they can be <u>received in</u> <u>person</u>, such as the home of a <u>trusted neighbor</u>, who stays home during the day
- Request that the shipper <u>hold your package</u> at Its pick-up facility so you can pick it up in person at your convenience
- Provide <u>delivery instructions</u> to the shipper so that packages can be left at a safe location at your home that is out of sight from the street
- If your employer will allow it, <u>have packages delivered to your place</u> of work
- Consider a <u>visible surveillance camera</u> and a security company sign near the front door

If you are interested in receiving information and you have not signed up, please send a text message to 7702843787 and type register in the body of the text. You then follow the prompts.

Playing a tennis match against an opponent is like any other competition. You must assess the strengths and weaknesses of your opponent, and then formulate a strategy for defeating your adversary based on those strengths and weaknesses.

Frequently I see players who lose a very winnable match because they did not implement the right game plan against their foe. Does he have a weak backhand? Does she struggle against topspin?Here's another acronym for you: ABT = Always Be Thinking. Start by varying your shots in the warm-up. Hit slice, topspin, high balls, low balls, hard shots, slow shots, and any other variations you can come up with. Then see how your opponent reacts to them. Keep a mental note of your opponent's tendencies and patterns.Use this information to your advantage.

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Lawn Care for November through December

Provided by Rachel Prakash, Cherokee County Master Gardener

- If you use large holiday decorations in the winter months, make sure to move them after a rain to prevent the grass beneath them from rotting.
- Make notes of any struggles you may have had with your lawn over the past year and plan to address them over the next year.

Cool Season Grasses (Fescue, Kentucky Bluegrass)

- Fertilize for the second time this season. Make sure to read the label and apply according to the directions.
- Sodding can be done at this time. Make sure that the soil stays moist, but not wet, for the first two weeks after laying sod. Try to prevent too much traffic from people and pets on the new sod.

Warm Season Grasses (Bermuda grass, Centipede, St. Augustine)

• These grasses should be dormant at this time. If you see spots of green, it is most likely a weedy grass that needs to be removed.



Fall Yard Clean Up List



YEA!!!! Fall is here! I would rather watch some football, visit the pumpkin patch, or sit around a fire pit than do yard work.... my grandpa always said, prepare it now and you can enjoy it later. I think his wise words could be used for more than just my yard but he LOVED his roses and the many other plants in his yard.

- Clean debris from base of roses and other ornamental plants
- · Rake and Mulch
- · Divide and cutback perennials
- Dig and store summer bulbs, dig up annuals, plant new blubs
- Clean up vegetable garden
- Lower height on the mower and mow one last time
- Stow your mower for the winter
- Aerate or dethatch the grass
- Feed the lawn and pre-emergence for the weeds
- Trim dead limbs and prune plants
- Plant Shrubs and Evergreens

- Bring Tender Container Plants indoor and protect cold sensitive plants
- Empty hose, Fountains, Drip Irrigation system,
- Turn off your outside water and store the hose
- · Get furnace surfaced
- Seal cracks around doors and windows
- Make sure there aren't any blockages in the fireplace
- Clean your gutters
- CHANGE the BATTERIES on the Smoke detectors

Remember the Birds

- · Clean out bird houses and bird baths
- Feed the Feed the birds, Feed the birds

EDITH

We would like to encourage every family to practice home escape plans and know where your meeting place will be. The acronym EDITH stands for Exit Drills in the Home. This is vital for all who live in your homes. Having two ways out of each room and knowing where you are going to meet when you get out to assure all have exited. Practice the plan with members of the family. Children as young as 3 can follow an escape plan if they have practiced it often. Teach your children not to hide when they encounter fire — not even if they have started it. Firefighters in protective gear can look frightening. Take them to a fire station to see and to meet firemen and learn that they are friends and come to help.

Smoke Alarms / Detectors

Having working smoke alarms (detectors) and testing them monthly will increase your survival rate. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) states that in every 3 out of 5 fire deaths there were no smoke alarms or ones that were not working. Parents should install an alarm on each level of the home and outside bedrooms or other sleeping areas. Remember to test alarms monthly and change batteries at least once a year — preferably twice, at biannual time changes. If an infant sleeps in a separate room, place an alarm in the room. Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can get outside quickly.

Grilling and Fire Pits

- When lighting your grill/pit, be sure that there are no leaks.
- If you smell gas, turn the grill off and have the problem repaired.
- Always open the lid of the grill before lighting.
- Never leave the grill/pit unattended.
- Keep the grill/pit away from the house and deck railings.
- Maintain at least three feet of clearance for children and pets.
- Always remember to turn your grill off and the gas to it when finished.
- Always extinguish the fire pit when finished.

Fall Burning

When burning outdoors, please remember to obtain a burn permit through Georgia Forestry at 1-877-OK2-BURN (652-2876) or online at www.gatrees.org/onlinepermits. There are some ordinances that you need to be aware of as well.

- There is no burning allowed on Sunday's or at night.
- The fire needs to be attended to at all times.
- Piles should be kept small and only burn what is in your yard.
- No trash or building supplies are allowed to be burned.

Woodstock proper is within the metro burning ban from May 1st through October 1st every year, which bans all outdoor burning.



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


